- At each Orientation session, the Director of Parent & Family Programs presents to the parents & families and remains with them throughout the entire 2-day session.


 Parents presented a Q&A program (3 each session) at all 11 Orientation sessions, throughout June & August.




They were exhausted, but happy & proud, especially because new parents were asking how they could help next year!



The Parents Association leadership approached the **CCPD** about hosting an reception in the Center for parents, families and students during Family Weekend. It was a huge hit!








- All families can call/email our office for assistance

Pros & Cons of Partnership

Pros

- Challenge: Connecting with Baylor Parents
 - Introducing the Baylor Parents Network
 - Volunteer-led, staff supported Chapters
 - What it is, Who we are, How it works (no dues!)
 - Informing Parents of Campus Resources
 - Inspiring Parents to Volunteer to connect with other Baylor Parents in local chapters

- Collaboration with the Office of New Student Programs
 - Baylor's New Student Programs help students transition well to the rigorous academic environment at Baylor.
 - Baylor's New Student Programs creates shared experiences, including Orientation, that foster belonging and excitement for new students and that inspire them to take ownership of their unique Baylor story.



- Summer Orientation
 - Orientation is a two-day experience designed to connect students to Baylor.
 - At Orientation, students and their guests explore the university's exceptional academic programs and learning environment, while also experiencing Baylor's unique supportive community.



- Orientation Parent Dinner
 - The evening of Day 1; students attend a separate dinner.
 - Immediately follows a "Parents' Guide to the First Year" orientation session.
 - Introduction to the Baylor Parents Network
 - Highlight: the Parent Panel Q&A





- Impact: Connecting with Baylor Parents
 - At Baylor, over 3000 new students and their families participate in summer orientation.
 - Baylor Parents Network's opportunity to personally meet parents of incoming students and to engage them in the life of the University.

Impact
