At Penn State, I lead the efforts of a 50-member advisory council and 25 student and family volunteers. I have also served as the chair of search committees, special task groups, and more.

Fiscally Responsible

In today's higher education environment, fiscal responsibility is more important than ever. Parent and family offices are often understaffed and underfunded but continue to do the good work of helping families. Penn State is no different. We are doing more with less each year and continue to maintain the quality of programs and services all while staying within our budget.

Equity Focused

goals was to diversify our council and volunteers. This has been an intentional process that continues every year. We now cover hotel expenses for members of the Parents Council who have a Pell-eligible student. We have created publications in Mandarin and Spanish and worked intentionally with our office for international students, Penn State Global, and the diversity offices throughout campus.
