expand that program to offer year-round family engagement programs and to help find sustainable resources for it.

Given her breadth of experience and commitment to her professional goals, I believe Missy would be a great asset to the AHEPPP Board of Directors. She has my full support, including institutional financial and other resources, to participate in regular board meetings and to attend two in-person board meetings per year.
