Participants will also learn strategies for managing up, navigating communication styles, and embracing healthy conflict through radical honesty to prevent groupthink and strengthen team performance. The session ultimately challenges leaders to move beyond compliance and cultivate “volunteer armies”—teams driven by purpose, autonomy, and shared ownership—equipping attendees with actionable strategies to immediately enhance supervision and foster thriving, engaged teams.</p>
